

In Alpabasa, students learn to decode and encode words in a fun and easy manner. With our program, children will learn to read words accurately. They will be able to move these words into their sight word memory through word/orthographic mapping. The children hear the word, they map it into syllables, then into its sounds, and then we connect the phonemes to its graphemes. // Just like how the children are doing it in this photo
